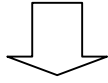


Exam entry checklist for Summer 2010

Check Initial Statement of Entry (with no re-sits)



Are your personal details (name, DoB) correct?

NO

See Mrs Fontivero immediately

YES

Have you been entered for all the correct units **AND cash-in codes**? Remember this **excludes re-sits**.

NO

See subject tutor immediately

YES

Have you been entered for any 'external' exams that you wish to sit (e.g. AS Greek)?

NO

Fill in the form in Mrs Fontivero/Mr Harman's office immediately. You will need to know the exam Board and code details.

YES

If appropriate, complete the re-sit form and hand in to Mrs Fontivero **with a cheque/cash** by the end of school, **Monday 15th March (DO NOT HAND THIS FORM IN ANYWHERE ELSE)**. Note that the January unit marks will be available on the **11th March** and that you therefore only have a short time to make your mind up about re-sitting – discuss this in advance with your subject tutors. You will then receive a **Final Statement of Entry** which will include any re-sits – check this **very carefully**.

If you hand the form in late your bill may double.

Re-sit advice for year 13.

The uniform mark grade boundaries in A levels are as follows:

Six unit course: Grade A: **480-600**, Grade B: **420-479**, Grade C: **360-419**, Grade D: **300-359**, Grade E: **240-299**.
Four unit course: Grade A: **320-400**, Grade B: **280-319**, Grade C: **240-279**, Grade D: **200-239**, Grade E: **160-199**.

Therefore you must add up all the uniform marks you have obtained so far and subtract that total from the number you need or want. This tells you how many uniform marks you require from your remaining units. If you think you will obtain these from your 'new' units then re-sits are not needed, if not then you need to consider re-sitting unit(s).

Remember that the individual grades for each unit are irrelevant at this stage.

E.g. 1: Y***i has sat 4 units of a 6 unit course and has achieved 356 uniform marks. She needs a grade B for her chosen university and is confident that she will score the required 64 marks out of the 200 available in her last 2 units. She decides re-sits in this subject are not necessary.

E.g. 2: K***I has sat 3 units of a 4 unit course and has achieved 238 uniform marks. He needs a grade A for his chosen university and therefore needs 82 out of the possible 100 marks in his remaining unit. He is not very confident about unit 4 and therefore decides to re-sit unit 1 where he scored 78/100 and thinks he can now pick up some of the 22 marks he 'missed' in his first sitting because he thinks he will now find unit 1 'easier' than unit 4.
